Chrysalis Flights lead participants on a transformation journey from caterpillars to butterflies, but what happens after the flight? What is the purpose of a butterfly? Butterflies need to lay eggs and start the cycle again so that many new caterpillars are born who will also transform through the chrysalis and become butterflies.

Emmaus Ministries is a Fourth Day movement and so it is really what happens after the event that makes a difference in the Kingdom of God.

The Emmaus Servanthood Model

When choosing the team for an event there are several factors that are taken into consideration. The first is volunteering. Volunteers are willing to serve and so generally make good team members.

The next factor is "Progressive Servanthood". People are chosen to serve at a low level initially and move up the responsibility ladder each time they serve. This helps the Emmaus Ministries Movement by equipping people for future events, and it helps people develop their leadership abilities for use in God's Kingdom. The aim on each team is to have one third experienced team members who have served many times, one third who have served once or twice and the final third new people who have never served.

The final factor is inclusiveness and diversity. Emmaus Ministries wants to get as many different people as possible to serve on team. The team members should also not all look the same. People from different denominations, ages, races and cultural background are chose where possible. Obviously, ability to perform the role is also important - non-musical musicians, for example, aren't of much use to the team.

There is a reason why you have been chosen to serve in your position!
